Christina's research has informed local, national and international policy documents including the House of Lord's Select Committee reports on Food, Diet and Obesity and Food, Poverty, Health and the Environment, the WHO European Region's 2022 report on obesity and local authority plans. Her work has received national and international press coverage, and she is Deputy Editor of the scientific journal Public Health Nutrition.





# ANNA TAYLOR



Anna joined The Food Foundation as its first Executive Director after 5 years at DFID leading the policy team on nutrition and supporting the delivery of the UK's global commitments to tackle undernutrition. She received an OBE for her work to address the global burden of undernutrition. She served as Chief Independent Adviser to Henry Dimbleby for the development of the National Food Strategy published in 2021.





# HENRY DIMBLEBY
